Some Things to Revise For

## EXAMPLES

### IDEAS AND DEVELOPMENT

**Elaboration** — expand and develop ideas more fully; add details, examples, reasons, and evidence

Smoking is bad for your health. **It causes damage to nearly every organ in the body and is directly responsible for a number of diseases.**

### SENTENCE VARIETY

Different sentence beginnings

**In the moonlight,** the surface of the sea sparkles.

### Alliteration

**When she climbs the stairs,** her brown curls bounce up and down.

### IDEAS AND DEVELOPMENT

**Snapshots** — “sketch” a person, place, or thing; describe with sensory details

### SENTENCE VARIETY

Different sentence lengths and structures

The sun set. **However,** the moon loomed on the horizon. **As the moon rose,** the temperature dropped, and the stars lit up the sky.

### ORGANIZATION

**Transitions** — connect ideas with transition words and phrases

### WORD CHOICE

**Specific Nouns** — more precise names for people, places, and things such as:

- dog → lapdog → Chihuahua
- pants → jeans → Wranglers

The car sped around the truck.  
↓  
The **Ferrari flew** past the **pick-up truck**.  
↓  
The trail was walked on by the boy in athletic shoes.  
↓  
The boy in **Air Jordans blazed** down the trail.  
↓  
She went home. → She **wandered** home.

### WORD CHOICE

**Action Verbs** — vivid verbs that show action in active voice (Avoid passive voice whenever possible.)

### IDEAS AND DEVELOPMENT

**Participial Phrases** — *-ing* and *-ed* verb phrases that add details

**Appositive Phrases** — noun phrases that rename another noun and add details

**Creaking in the wind,** the old house — **a dilapidated log cabin** — **begged for attention** as smoke puffed from its chimney **like an SOS signal.**

### WORD CHOICE

**Figurative Language:**

- **Personification** — gives human characteristics to something nonhuman
- **Similes** — compares two different things in an interesting way using *like* or *as*
